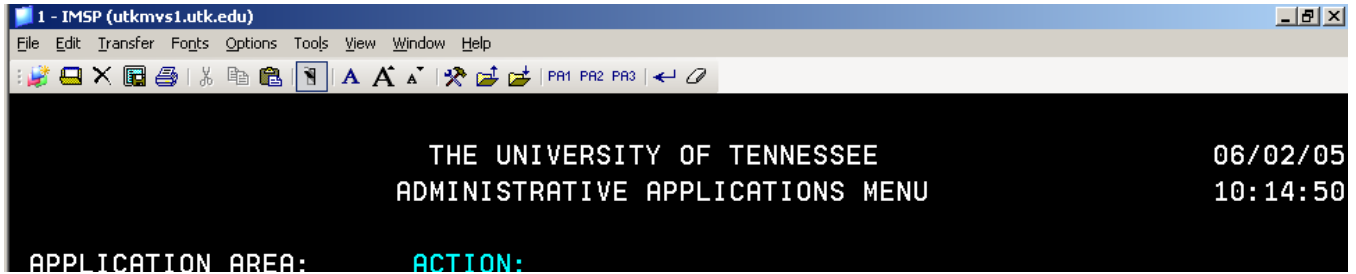


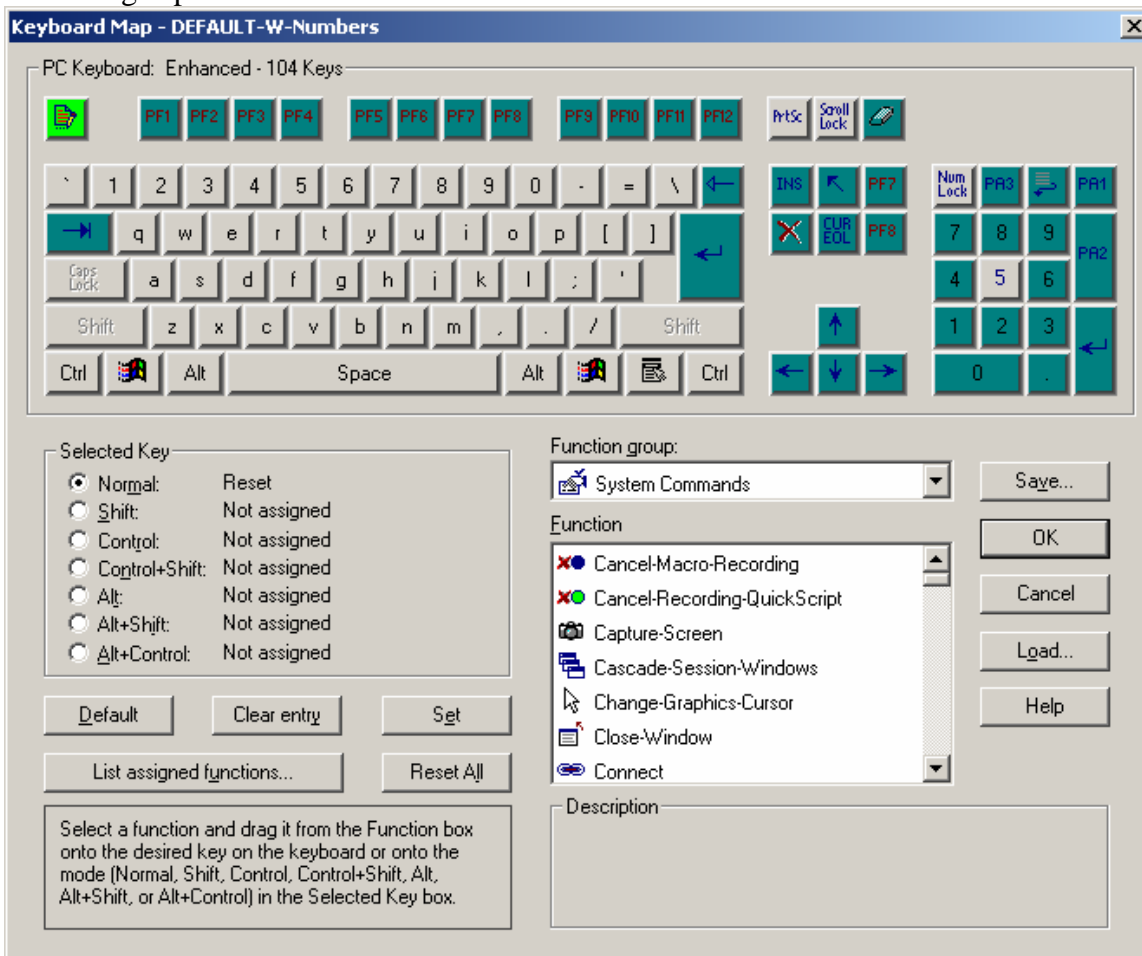
How to enable the Numeric Key Pad for entering numbers in Hummingbird:

Open Hummingbird as usual. In any screen, such as below:



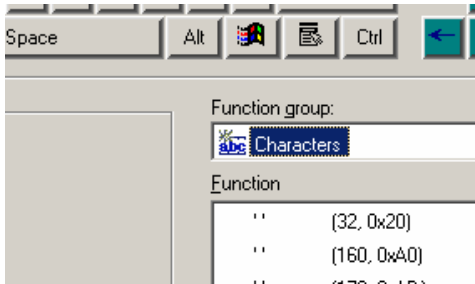
there are several choices along the top row. Click on the word "Options", then "Keyboard Mapping."

This brings up a new window:

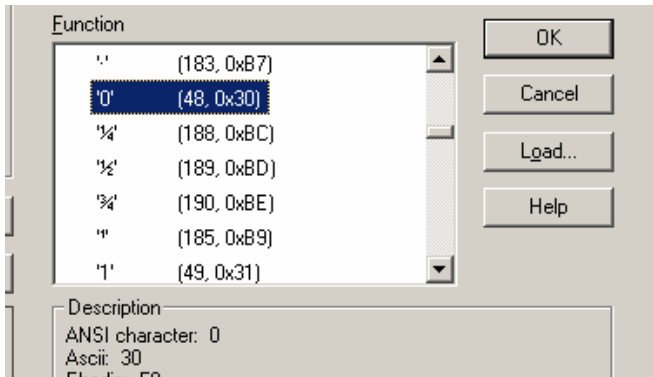


I have already changed my number pad so that numbers show. Yours can have any other symbol showing, including arrows.

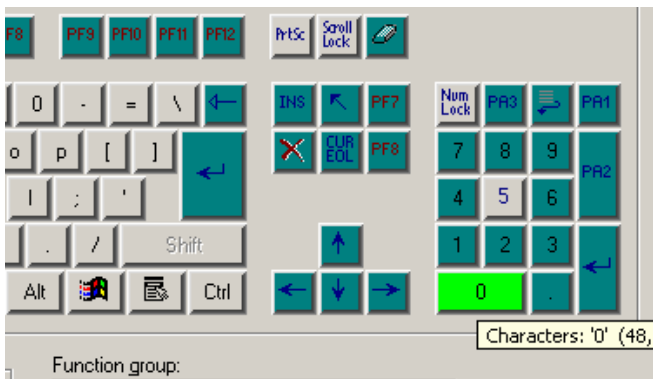
Under "Function group" choose "Characters".



Scroll down in the “Function” box (just below the “Function group” box) until you see the character “0”. Select it.



Then look at the picture of the key board, and select the key that is used as a number “0” in the number pad. It should change color (probably to lime green).



Click “Set”.

Scroll down in the Function box until you see the number “1”, select it. Then select the picture of the key that is used as a number “1”, Click “Set” again. Continue on through the number 9. If you want to set the decimal point (or period symbol), it is in the Function box before the number 0. It is the 16th choice from the top, and it is “.” [46, 0x2E].

Select OK when you are done. A prompt will come up, “Keymap has changed. Do you want to save it?” Select “Yes”, and another box opens with several file names. The cursor will be in a blank box. Name your new settings “Keypad-Numbers” (or whatever you want.) Click “Save”. You’re done! Hope this helps.
