In order to progress into the Social Work major, students must maintain a minimum grade point average of 2.0 in this specified curriculum. To obtain full progression, which occurs prior to the senior year, students must maintain a 2.0 cumulative grade point average with a "C" or better in Social Work 2000, 2050, and all junior year social work courses; complete fifty (50) clock hours in community service; receive a satisfactory field practice evaluation; receive a favorable review by the social work faculty; and successfully complete a minimum of 90 semester hours.

Initial progression into the junior year is also determined by the number of available field practice slots in social service agencies and classroom space. If the number of students who fulfill the above criteria exceeds the number of students that can be accommodated, students will be selected on the basis of grades received in Social Work 2000 and 2050, evaluation of volunteer service, writing skills demonstrated in the application essay, and cumulative GPA for courses completed.

\*\*Volunteer Activity-students must complete 50 clock hours of volunteer service at one public or private social service agency. This must be done after admission to PSTCC and during the last 24 months, prior to transfer to UT. Volunteer service must be documented on forms provided by your advisor.
