Students planning to enter the MAcc program should take Acc 414 or Acc 431 for Information Management 442 in the Information Management collateral; for Logistics 421 in the Logistics collateral; for Finance 455 in the Finance collateral; and for Management 471 in the International Business collateral. Accounting 414 and 431 are both prerequisites to the MAcc program.
