Students who choose MATH 1630 must take MATH 1130 before MATH 1630 if they do not have an ACT math score of at least 21 or have not completed precalculus (23 ACT for MATH 1830). Students who choose MATH 1910 must take MATH 1730 before MATH 1910 if they do not have an ACT math score of at least 26.
